

Emergency Assistance Application

This application can be used for either Emergency Scholarships or Emergency Loans. Emergency Scholarships do not have to be repaid. Students can only receive one Emergency Scholarship award during their education at Del Mar College. Students may receive multiple Emergency Loans as long as all previous loans have been repaid. These funds are short-term, no-cost loans and must be repaid by the end of the semester in which they were awarded unless special arrangements have been made with the Foundation Office.

Emergency Assistance is for students who experience an unexpected and unforeseen circumstance which jeopardizes their ability to pay for their education. Awards are generally limited to a maximum of \$750 for full time students and \$400 for part time students. Priority is given to students who have compelling emergencies, have exhibited due diligence in planning and financing their education up to this emergency, have exhibited due diligence in exploring funding options, and have demonstrated commitment toward their academic pursuit as evidenced through GPA performance. Students who have exceeded their Financial Aid maximum allotment will be considered only under compelling extenuating circumstances. Additional consideration will be given to those students whose demonstrated need will help them in the completion of their academic program. Emergency funds are limited and availability varies from semester to semester. Financial Aid funds cannot be duplicated through emergency assistance.

Processing begins when the complete application packet has been submitted to the Office of Development/Foundation, DMC Center for Economic Development, Room 133, 3209 S. Staples (S. Staples and Kostoryz). For the status of your application, contact the DMC Foundation Office at 361-698-1317.

Emergency Assistance Application Procedure

All six bullets **MUST** be completed and submitted or your application will be denied.

- Apply for Financial Aid and provide documentation of loans, grants, monies received, and/or declination letter or email you received.
- Complete the attached two-page Del Mar College Foundation Emergency Assistance Application.
- Write a one-page explanation describing, in detail, your need for emergency funding and write down exactly what you are requesting, including dollar amounts for each expense.
- Attach proof of your GPA/Transcript (unofficial is fine); minimum 2.0 GPA required to apply.
- If you had a medical illness, attach documentation that illustrates the nature of your emergency: accident reports, hospital discharge notices, invoices for repairs, etc. You can skip this item if it does not apply to you.
- Attach your current education plan (created and signed by your advisor, including grades) and your current class schedule; a minimum of 6 credit hours required.

The following expenses are considered for support:

- **Tuition** If requesting assistance with tuition, attach a printout of your DMC tuition balance.
- **Books** If requesting assistance to purchase books, please provide two price quotes from these vendors only: DMC Campus Bookstore and Student Bookstore (formerly Neebo). Detailed instructions are located on the Del Mar College website: Click here to open detailed instructions for book quotes on our website.
- **Supplies/Tools** If requesting assistance to purchase supplies and/or tools, obtain a list of the required items from your instructor and have him/her sign it. You will need an itemized cost estimate from at least two vendors.
- **Childcare** If requesting assistance with childcare, obtain a signed estimate for services from a licensed childcare facility and a copy of their license.

Please Note:

- Students who have previously been awarded an Emergency Scholarship cannot re-apply. Students are allowed only one Emergency Scholarship while attending Del Mar College.
- Students who have previously been awarded an Emergency Loan and repaid that loan are eligible to apply for another Emergency Loan.
