


MLA Works Cited Page

What is the MLA Work Cited page? The Works Cited page is a list of sources you quoted, paraphrased, or summarized in your paper; you must document, or cite, borrowed words, ideas, or facts by creating a Works Cited list at the end of your paper.



How do I format my Works Cited page?

- Your Works Cited list begins on a new page at the end of your paper
- Number your Works Cited as the next page in your paper
- Center title--Works Cited
- Double space entire document
- Entries listed alphabetically by the authors' last names (No author? Use the title to alphabetize)

How should individual entries be formatted?

- The first line of each entry is flush with the left margin
- All other lines are indented five spaces to create a hanging indention
- Space once after all punctuation
